New Employment Relationships



Effect of Gig or OnDemand Economy

Advantages

- Flexible schedules
- Favors those who don't want to work 80 hours a week for the "man"
- Younger workers seeking the work/life balance previous generations gave up

Disadvantages

- Erratic schedules
- No benefits
- No social security
- Safety
- Legal protections
- Retirement plans
- WC exposure (borrowed servant doctrine)

Alternate Forms of Insurance

Challenges

- Declining market
 - Declining frequency and increasing severity (not always a good thing)
 - Gig economy
- Propublica (and DOL)
- Nationalization
- 1972 Re-do
- Constitutional challenges (OK & FL)
- State variations

What Could It Look Like?

- 24/7 plan: disability with health insurance (think ACA)
- One proposal: no WC for 90% of jobs that are not hazardous; require ER to offer STD
- Or a version of non-subscription

Claims Technology

- Most experts believe claims technology lags other industries

Increasing Medical Severity

- Old treatment we should no longer be using (fusions and meniscus repair)
- New technologies and treatment
- Consolidation of HCP
- Business of medicine
- Multidisciplinary medicine
- Caution: medical errors are the 3rd leading cause of death in US

- Big pharma
- National issue
- Networks
- PDMP
- Medical Marijuana



WC Relies on Premiums on EEs

- Gig economy (think Uber)
 - Demand economy
 - Growing fast
- Related to PEO/SLA/Temp
 - ERs moving employees off their books
- Independent contractor
 - Because employees want it
 - Employer fraud
- Challenges (long tail line, cost shifting, frequency, severity)
