SOCIAL DISTANCING

Texas PRIMA will utilize a sticker-based system on name badges for attendees to show their level of comfort with other attendees. You can pick your dot up at registration!

- Green means the attendee is open to High Fives and Handshakes
- Yellow means the attendee is cautious and would prefer to interact with elbows
- Red means the attendee prefers to remain 6 feet apart and avoid physical interaction with others.

Be considerate of fellow attendees, respect their social distancing requests, and exercise good judgement.

MASKS
